WSP USA FIELD SERVICES DISASTER AWARENESS REPORT

September 10, 2026

Flash Flood Threat

Midwest U.S.

- A sprawling flash flood threat stretches along a 1,300-mile corridor from North Texas to southern New Jersey Thursday, with some of the heaviest rain expected across the central Appalachians and Ohio Valley.
- Thunderstorms were ongoing across southern Ohio early Thursday, which are expected to move across the Appalachians through the day and arrive over Washington, D.C. and other parts of the Mid-Atlantic by Thursday night.
- Flooding will be the biggest threat as storms tap into tropical moisture moving north from the Gulf.
- A Level 2 out of 4 flood risk is in place for parts of Ohio, Pennsylvania and West Virginia through Friday morning.
- Thunderstorms are expected to fire along the cold front in the Southern Plains beginning Thursday afternoon, potentially producing rain rates of 2-3 inches per hour.
- Most storms will not be severe, but a few could produce wind gusts of 50 to 60 mph, especially in northern Arkansas and southern Missouri.
- By Friday, the front will reach the Southeast, bringing more showers and downpours and a Level 1 flash flood threat from the Carolinas to the Gulf Coast and Florida, the FOX Forecast Center said.



Tropical Activity – Eastern & Central Pacific

Tropical Storm Lowell

- Located 710 miles NW of Lihue, Hawaii moving W at 15 mph.
- Maximum sustained winds of 60 mph.
- A general westward motion is forecast to continue for the next day or so. Then, the system is expected to slow down and turn northeastward this weekend.

Tropical Storm Norbert

- Located 755 miles SWE of the southern tip of Baja California with maximum sustained winds of 40 mph.
- Moving toward the west near 14 mph and this motion is expected to continue through Friday.
- Gradual strengthening is forecast over the next several days.
- Tropical-storm-force winds extend outward up to 60 miles from the center.

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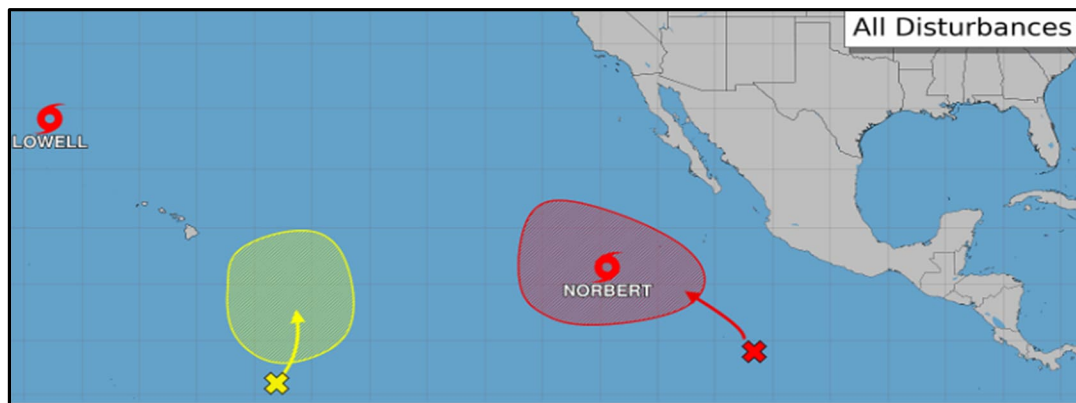
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Disturbance 1

- Located well to SSE of the Hawaiian Islands.
- Some gradual development of this system is possible late this week and into the weekend.
- Moving generally northward and then meanders to the SE of the Hawaiian Islands.
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (20%); 7 days: Low (30%)

Disturbance 2

- Located several hundred miles SW of the southwestern Mexico coast.
- Gradual development of this system is expected, and a tropical depression is likely to form by early next week.
- Moving generally westward over central and western portions of the East Pacific.
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (10%); 7 days: High (70%)



Disaster Declaration Request Tennessee

- On September 8, 2026, the State of Tennessee requested federal disaster assistance through FEMA's Individual Assistance for Shelby County following the severe storms in August.
- A powerful bow echo/severe squall line moved through Memphis and Shelby County on August 22, producing destructive straight-line winds generally reported at 70–80+ mph.
- Strong winds damaged homes, roofs and other residential structures, while falling trees and limbs caused additional property damage. Utility poles and power lines were also heavily damaged.
- More than 134,000 customers lost power in Shelby County; congressional correspondence later cited more than 140,000 MLGW customers without power at the height of the event.
