

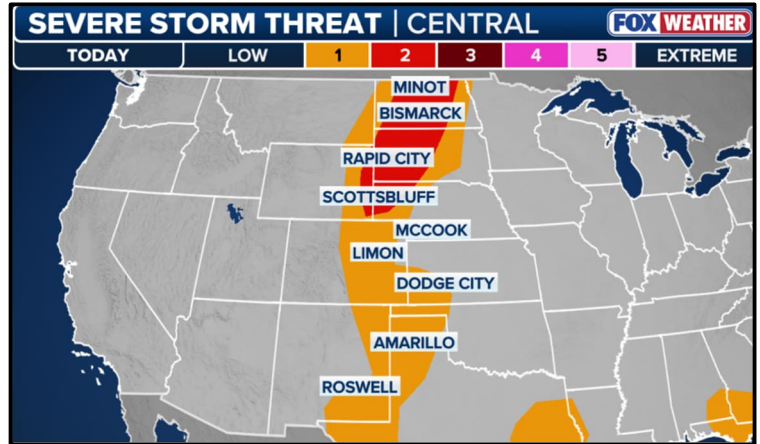

June 2, 2026

Severe Storm Threat Central U.S.

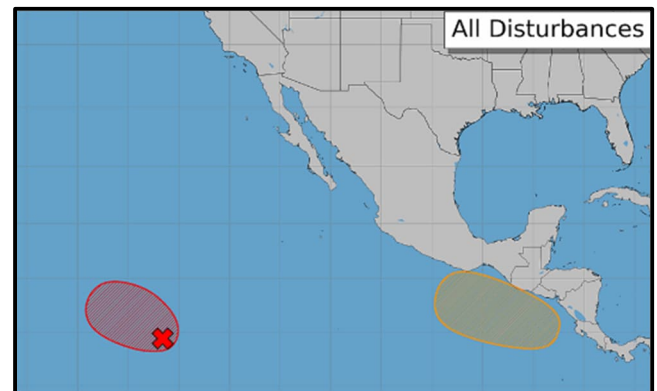
- Baseball-sized hail and tornadoes are possible across parts of North and South Dakota, which are in the bull's-eye of a sprawling severe weather threat Tuesday that stretches from the Dakotas to the Texas Panhandle and eastern New Mexico.
- This threat is part of a broader weather pattern that produced a powerful hail-storm over Denver on Monday afternoon and will bring a stretch of severe storms and potential flash flooding across the Plains through the week.
- A Level 2 out of 5 risk of severe thunderstorms covers parts of eastern Wyoming, northwestern Nebraska, as well as North and South Dakota, including Bismarck and Rapid City, according to NOAA's Storm Prediction Center.
- The main hazards in this area are baseball-sized hail and damaging wind gusts. A few tornadoes are possible with any supercell thunderstorms that are able to develop. Parts of North Dakota are also under a Level 2 out of 4 flash flood threat.



Tropical Activity - Pacific

Disturbance #1

- Located well southwest of the southern tip of the Baja California Peninsula.
- Continued development is expected, and a tropical depression is likely to form later today while the system moves west northwestward at 10-15 mph across the western portion of the East Pacific.
- Formation chance through 48 hours – High (90%)
- Formation chance through 7 days – High (90%)



Disturbance #2

- An area of low pressure is forecast to form offshore of Central America and southern Mexico late this week or this weekend.
- Environmental conditions appear conducive for some development of this system and a tropical depression could form early next week while it moves slowly north northwestward or northward.
- Formation chance through 48 hours – Low (near 0%)
- Formation chance through 7 days – Medium (40%)
