

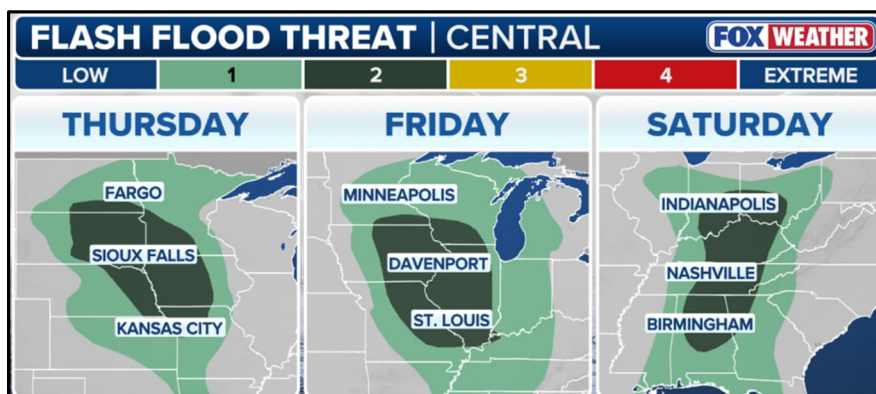

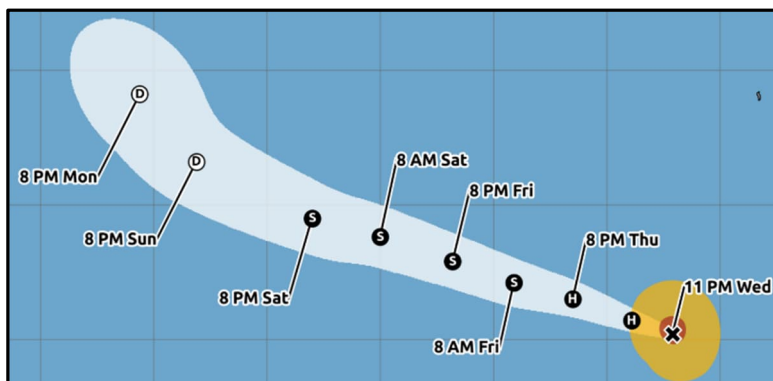
Flash Flood Threat Central U.S.

- A stormy weather pattern is moving into the Central Plains and the Midwest, kicking off a multiday stretch of heavy rain and flash flood concerns for millions of people that will last through the weekend.
- The bull's-eye of Thursday's flood risk will be across parts of the Central Plains and Upper Midwest, which will shift east into the weekend, eventually reaching parts of the Southeast by Saturday.
- NOAA's Weather Prediction Center (WPC) has issued a Level 2 out of 4 risk of flash flooding for parts of eastern South Dakota, eastern Nebraska, western Iowa, southwest Minnesota, eastern Kansas, and northern Missouri on Thursday.
- The most intense storms are expected across parts of central South Dakota and north-central Nebraska, where NOAA's Storm Prediction Center (SPC) has issued a Level 2 out of 5 risk of severe thunderstorms Thursday.
- Areas that receive heavy rain on Thursday will be more vulnerable to flooding if another round of storms develops.
- There is still some uncertainty about exactly where the heaviest rain sets up, rainfall totals exceeding 3 inches are possible.
- By Friday, the heavy rain threat shifts farther east into the Upper and Middle Mississippi Valley.



Tropical Activity – Pacific Hurricane Genevieve (CAT 1)

- Located 805 miles W of the southern tip of Baja California with maximum sustained winds of 90 mph.
- Moving WNW at 12 mph.
- Hurricane-force winds extend outward up to 45 miles; tropical-storm-force winds extend outward up to 140 miles.
- Continued gradual weakening is expected as Genevieve moves over cooler waters and encounters less favorable atmospheric conditions.



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Preliminary Damage Assessments

Colorado

- The Aspen Acres Fire is one of Colorado's most destructive wildfires of the 2026 fire season.
- The fire ignited in late June 2026 west of the communities of Rye, Beulah, and San Isabel in Pueblo and Custer counties and has burned 101,921 acres.
- Currently at 66% containment.
- According to Pueblo County Sheriff David Lucero, the number of homes and commercial properties destroyed in Pueblo County is 241. Sheriff Lucero said the lost structures include 208 in Beulah, 28 in Rye, two in Colorado City, and three in unincorporated Pueblo County.
- Custer County Sheriff Rich Smith said the total in Custer has climbed to 85.
- Thousands of residents from Colorado City, Beulah, Rye, and San Isabel were placed under evacuation orders as the fire threatened neighborhoods.
- Damage assessments and recovery efforts continue for homeowners who lost residences and other structures.
