August 10, 2026

Severe Storm Threat Eastern U.S.

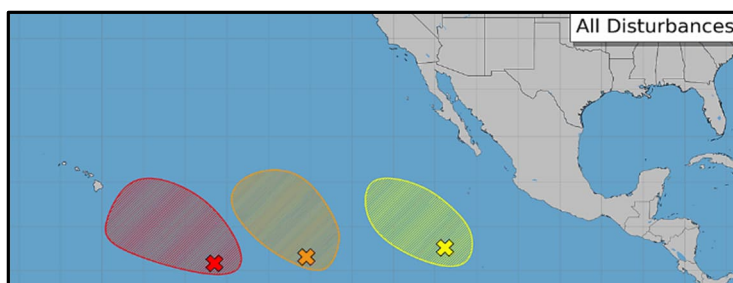
- A round of severe weather is targeting parts of the Midwest, Great Lakes and the Ohio Valley beginning Monday afternoon.
- This stormy pattern will remain over the region for much of the week, with thunderstorms tapping into high humidity to produce heavy rain and a flash flood threat.
- NOAA's Storm Prediction Center (SPC) has issued a Level 2 out of 5 risk of severe thunderstorms across a corridor from northern and central Illinois to eastern Pennsylvania, as well as parts of northern West Virginia and western Maryland.
- This includes the Chicago, Indianapolis, Cleveland, Pittsburgh, Baltimore and Scranton, Pennsylvania, and metro areas. Large hail, damaging wind gusts, and an isolated tornado are all possible.
- Tuesday's severe weather threat will shift slightly south, farther into the central Appalachians and into Virginia.
- Widespread rain totals of 2 to 3 inches are expected from Chicago to Cleveland, with localized pockets of 3 to 5 inches of rain possible in northern Indiana and Ohio where those repeat showers occur.



Tropical Activity – Eastern & Central Pacific

Disturbance 1

- Located 1100 miles ESE of the Hawaiian Islands.
- Environmental conditions are forecast to be conducive for further development, and a tropical depression is likely to form by mid-week.
- Moving WNW across the Central Pacific.
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Med (near 50%); 7-day: High (90%)



Disturbance 2

- Located well to the WSW of the southern tip of Baja California Peninsula.
- Conditions appear conducive for some gradual development, and a tropical depression could form during the next few days.
- Moving slowly WNW across the western portion of East Pacific.
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (near 30%); 7-day: Med (60%)

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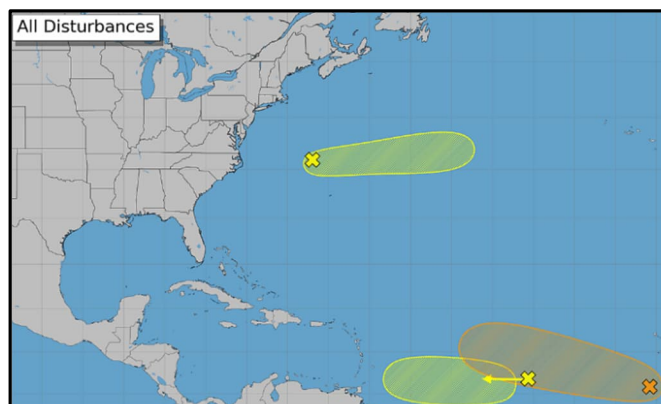
Disturbance 3

- Located several hundred miles south-southwest of the southern tip of Baja California Peninsula.
- Conditions appear to be only marginally conducive for slow development during the next day or two.
- Moving WNW at around 15 mph and by late Tuesday or Wednesday, the system is expected to reach an area of strong upper-level winds, ending its change for development.
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (near 10%); 7-day: Low (10%)

Tropical Activity – Atlantic

Disturbance 1

- Located a few hundred miles south of the Cabo Verde Islands.
- As the system moves slowly westward, a tropical wave currently over west Africa is expected to merge with it in a couple of days.
- Environmental conditions are forecast to be more conducive for development by midweek, and a tropical depression could form during the latter half of this week.
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (near 20%); 7-day: Med (60%)



Disturbance 2

- A broad area of showers and thunderstorms associated with a tropical wave is located about midway between the coast of west Africa and the Lesser Antilles.
- Some gradual development of this system is possible through mid-week while it moves quickly westward across the central tropical Atlantic.
- Upper-level winds are expected to become less favorable for development later in the week as the system approaches the Lesser Antilles.
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (near 10%); 7-day: Low (10%)

Disturbance 3

- A trough of low pressure located a few hundred miles northwest of Bermuda is producing disorganized shower and thunderstorm activity.
- Some development of this system is possible during the next couple of days while it moves quickly eastward, well to the north of Bermuda.
- The system is forecast to reach cooler waters later this week, ending its chances of formation after Wednesday.
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (near 10%); 7-day: Low (10%)
