

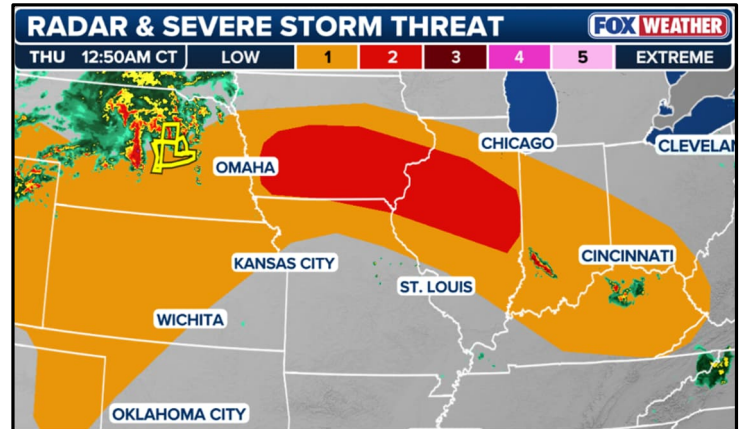

August 13, 2026

## Severe Storm Threat Ohio Valley

- Millions across parts of the Midwest and Ohio Valley are bracing for another round of thunderstorms and flash flooding Thursday.
- Relentless storms will develop and move along a stalled weather front, with the potential for periods of heavy rain lasting through the weekend.
- A strong cluster of thunderstorms developed over parts of Nebraska and Iowa early Thursday, prompting Tornado Warnings. That system is expected to track across Illinois and Indiana through the day.
- NOAA's Storm Prediction Center (SPC) has issued a Level 2 out of 5 risk of severe thunderstorms across central and southern Iowa to central Illinois, including Des Moines, Peoria and Springfield.
- Damaging wind gusts will be the primary threat from any severe thunderstorms that develop.
- A second round of heavy rain is expected to develop over this area Thursday night into Friday morning, potentially bringing an even greater threat as storms repeatedly track over the same locations.
- Flood Watches are in place across portions of Indiana, Ohio, West Virginia, northeast Kentucky, western Virginia, Pennsylvania, North Carolina and east Tennessee through Friday.
- According to the FOX Forecast Center, widespread rainfall totals of 1 to 2 inches are likely, with locally 2 to 3 inches or more possible.



## Flooding Activity Indiana

- Flash Flood Emergencies were issued Wednesday across east-central Indiana as torrential rainfall caused life-threatening flash flooding across the region.
- The National Weather Service (NWS) urged residents to move to higher ground in several counties, including Wayne, Fayette, Delaware, Franklin and Union.
- In Muncie, officials said evacuations were underway due to ongoing flooding, with emergency personnel going door-to-door to help residents safely evacuate affected homes.
- The flooding comes as severe storms stretch at least 250 miles long and 60 miles wide on Tuesday.
- According to the FOX Forecast Center, destructive storms that produced 90 to 100 mph winds moved across northern Indiana.
- The storms have also left more than 292,400 customers across Indiana without power.

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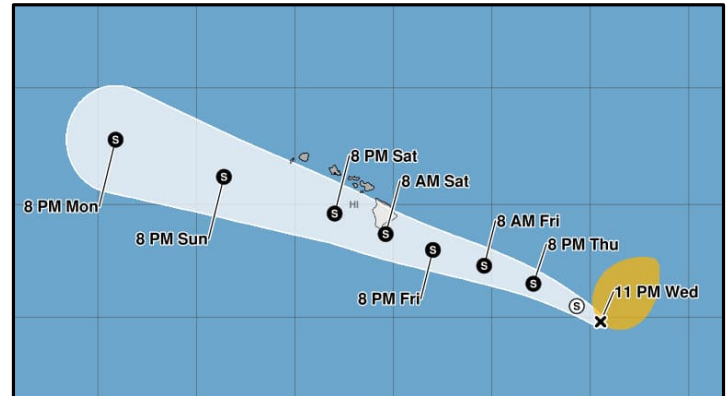
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## Tropical Activity – Eastern & Central Pacific

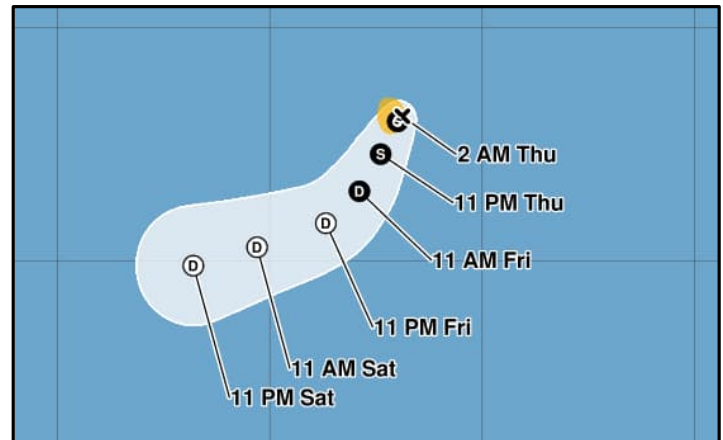
### Potential Tropical Cyclone One-C

- Located 985 miles ESE of Honolulu, Hawaii.
- The system is moving toward the west near 10 mph, and a turn toward the west-north-west is expected on Thursday.
- On the forecast track, the center will be nearing the Hawaiian Islands by late Friday.
- Recent satellite wind data indicate that maximum sustained winds are near 40 mph with higher gusts.
- The system still lacks sufficient organized shower and thunderstorm activity to be considered a tropical storm.
- The disturbance is forecast to become a tropical storm by Thursday night, and additional strengthening is forecast thereafter.
- Formation chance – 48-hour: High (90%); 7-day: High (90%)



### Tropical Storm Hernan

- Located 1460 miles west of the southern tip of Baja California.
- Hernan is moving toward the west near 2 mph.
- A gradual turn to the southwest is expected over the next day or so.
- Maximum sustained winds are near 40 mph with higher gusts.
- Slight strengthening is possible through tonight. Weakening is expected to begin by Friday.
- Tropical-storm-force winds extend outward up to 40 miles from the center.



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## Tropical Activity – Atlantic

### Tropical Depression Cristobal

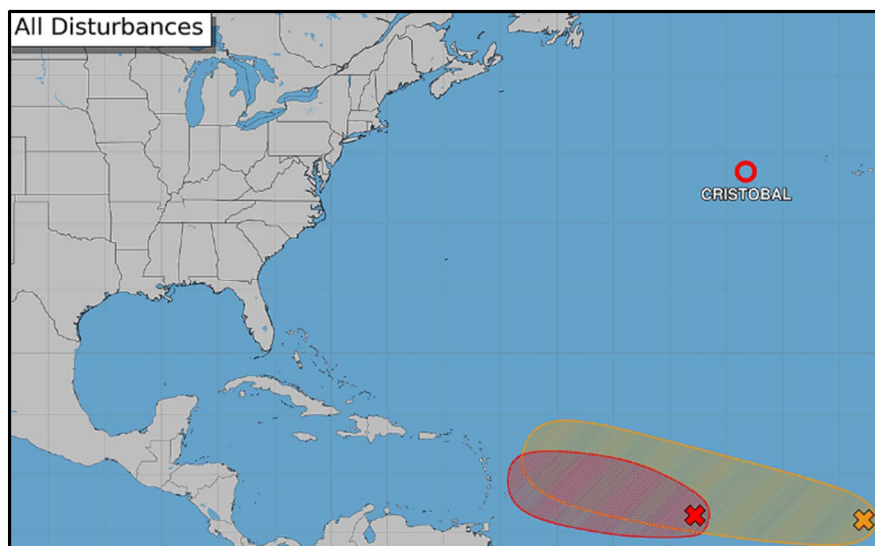
- Located 610 miles west of the Azores.
- Maximum sustained winds are near 35 mph with higher gusts.
- The depression is moving toward the northeast near 16 mph, and this general motion is expected to continue through today.
- Weakening is forecast, and Cristobal is forecast to dissipate later today.

### Disturbance 1

- Located 1000 miles east of the Lesser Antilles.
- This system will likely become a short-lived tropical depression during the next day or two while moving westward across the tropical Atlantic.
- By Friday, this system is expected to move into a region of strong upper-level winds and dry air, which should end its opportunity to develop.
- Formation chance – 48-hour: High (80%); 7-day: High (80%)

### Disturbance 2

- Located a few hundred miles south-southwest of the Cabo Verde Islands.
- Conditions forecast to be generally conducive for gradually development.
- A tropical depression could form late this week or this weekend while it moves westward or west-northwestward across the eastern and central tropical Atlantic.
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (30%); 7-day: Med (50%)



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## Disaster Declaration Request

### Guam

- Super Typhoon Bavi affected Guam on July 5–6, 2026, as a powerful Category 5 typhoon moved through the Mariana Islands.
- Bavi did not make a direct landfall on Guam; the storm's eye/strongest core passed over Rota, but Guam experienced significant typhoon-force winds, heavy rainfall and flooding impacts.
- Super Typhoon Bavi reached maximum sustained winds of approximately 180 mph, with gusts up to 215 mph near the strongest part of the system.
- Guam experienced periods of intense rainfall and flooding, with the National Weather Service warning of potentially 12–20 inches of rain across portions of the Marianas.
- Guam residents reported roof/exterior damage, water intrusion, flooding, fallen trees and debris, as well as losses associated with extended utility outages.
- The Guam Recovery Office began collecting residential damage reports on July 16, with the reporting period ending July 24.
- Following the IDA, Guam and FEMA conducted an Individual Assistance Joint Preliminary Damage Assessment (JPDA) July 28–31, with FEMA, SBA and Guam representatives visiting reported damaged residences to validate the damage.
