

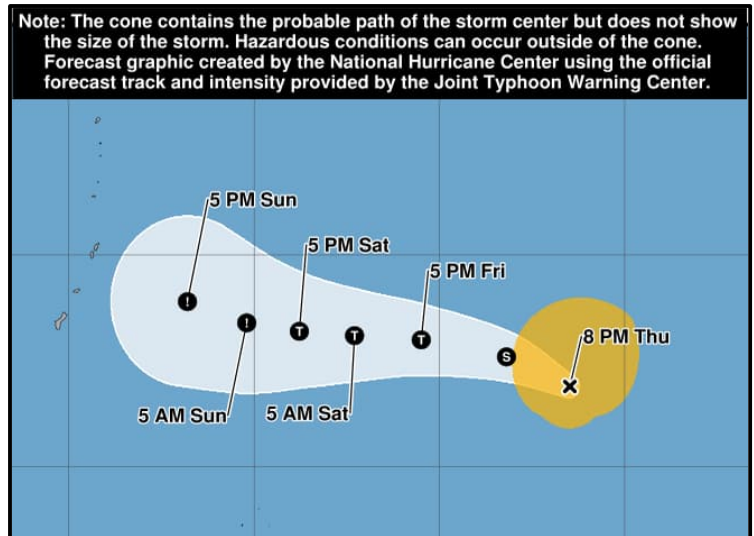

July 2, 2026

## Tropical Activity – Western Pacific Tropical Storm Bavi

- Tropical Storm Bavi is forecast to undergo rapid intensification from late July 2, 2026, and become a super typhoon as it approaches the Northern Mariana Islands.
- Currently located 930 miles E of Guam moving WNW at 15 mph.
- Maximum sustained winds of 60 mph; tropical storm force winds extend outward from the center up to 160 miles.
- Bavi is expected to strengthen slowly during the following 12 hours before entering a longer period of rapid intensification.
- The latest forecast calls for the system to peak as a super typhoon and pass south of Tinian.
- Potential impacts across the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands and Guam will depend on Bavi's eventual track, size, and intensity.
- There is a possibility that Bavi could become the strongest July typhoon to directly pass through the area since the beginning of reliable records.



## Wildfire Activity

### Colorado

- A destructive wildfire burning across southern Colorado nearly doubled in size Wednesday and is now the nation's "number one" fire priority, according to Phil Daniels, the incident commander with the state's Division of Fire Prevention and Control.
- The Aspen Acres Fire broke out Monday across Pueblo and Custer counties, ballooning to over 47,950 acres after destroying at least 180 buildings and injuring a firefighter, as the entire Four Corners region grapples with dangerous fire weather conditions.
- The Aspen Acres Fire is currently at 0% containment.
- Local sheriffs said more homes and buildings could be destroyed after the wind direction prevented officials from conducting an updated assessment Wednesday.
- The fire is now one of five major wildfires burning in Colorado.
- Mandatory evacuations expanded Wednesday are in effect for multiple towns in the area, including Beulah, Rye and San Isabel.
- Fire Weather Watches and Warnings remain through Thursday across Colorado, Wyoming, Utah, Arizona and New Mexico.
