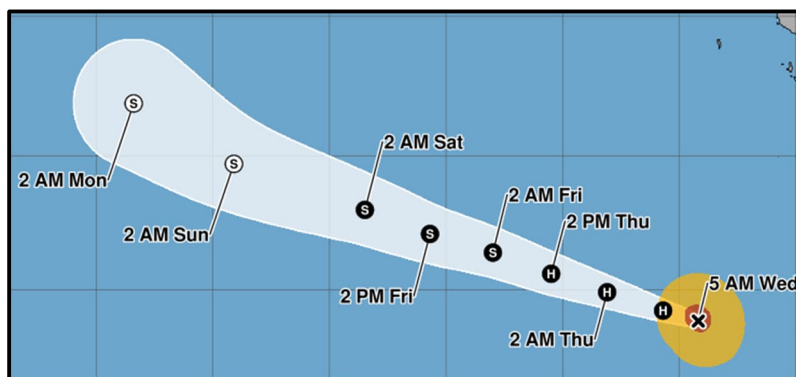
Flash Flood Risk Northeast/New England

- Rounds of heavy rain are ongoing across parts of the Northeast, impacting travel for millions of people, as the bull's-eye of a multiday flood threat begins to shift into New England.
- Hundreds of flights were canceled Tuesday at airports in New York City, Philadelphia and Boston as a fall-like storm swept into the region.
- A secondary area of low pressure has formed off the coast of New York's Long Island and is sending heavy rain across the Island and into parts of southern New England and Upstate New York.
- Some basements of several homes in Catskill, New York, were inundated early Wednesday.
- Flash Flood Warnings have been issued through Wednesday for parts of New York's Lower Hudson Valley, including Westchester, Putnam and Dutchess counties, as well as the Capital Region, including Albany.
- A Flash Flood Warning was also issued for Fairfield and New Haven counties in Connecticut through early Wednesday morning.
- NOAA's Weather Prediction Center (WPC) has issued a Level 3 out of 4 risk of flash flooding for western and southern Massachusetts, southern Vermont, and parts of northern Connecticut.
- The heaviest rain is expected to shift east through Wednesday. Wednesday's storms will also bring strong gusty winds to New England.



Tropical Activity – Eastern & Central Pacific Hurricane Genevieve (CAT 3)

- Located 630 miles WSW of the southern tip of Baja California moving WNW at 9 mph.
- Maximum sustained winds of 120 mph.
- Hurricane-force winds extend outward up to 40 miles; tropical-storm-force winds extend outward up to 140 miles.
- Some weakening is expected during the next few days.
- Forecast to remain a hurricane through Thursday night or early Friday.



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Tropical Depression Fausto

- Located 255 miles ENE of Honolulu, HI moving WNW at 12mph.
- Maximum sustained winds of 35 mph.
- Expected to become a post-tropical remnant low today.
