

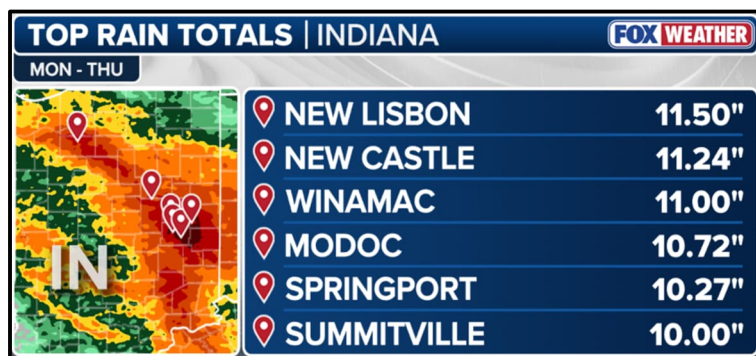

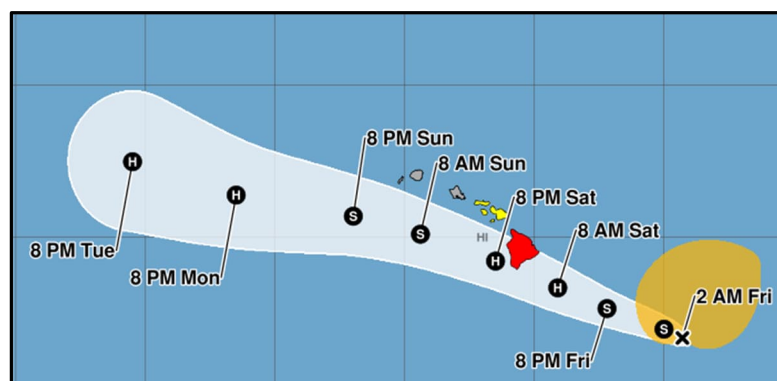
Severe Weather & Flood Activity Indiana

- Response and recovery operations continue in Indiana following severe weather, flooding, derecho, and tornadic activity.
- Entire neighborhoods in Indiana are underwater after the White River rose to record-breaking levels, cresting at more than 24.5 feet, which is over a foot higher than the record set in 1913.
- Since Tuesday, more than 11 inches of rain have fallen east of Indianapolis. Gov. Mike Braun declared a state of emergency on Thursday and mobilized the Indiana National Guard.
- In Anderson, Indiana, people were ordered to evacuate after several feet of water covered streets and surrounded homes.
- Meanwhile, in nearby Franklin County, swampy water covered train tracks and streets, and for the second consecutive day, several feet of water surrounded homes in Cambridge City.
- First responders have rescued dozens of people across the region.
- The flooding could still worsen as the river is expected to continue to spill over its banks until Sunday.
- As of Friday morning, nearly 200,000 customers were still without power in the state, according to PowerOutage.US.



Tropical Activity – Eastern & Central Pacific Tropical Storm Lala

- Located 435 miles ESE of Hilo Hawaii and about 650 miles ESE of Honolulu Hawaii.
- Lala is moving toward the west-north-west near 10 mph.
- This general motion is expected to continue, taking the core of Lala near the Big Island of Hawaii on Saturday and then south of the smaller islands on Sunday.
- Maximum sustained winds remain near 60 mph with higher gusts.
- Steady strengthening is forecast, and Lala is expected to become a hurricane as it approaches the Big Island.
- Tropical-storm-force winds extend outward up to 275 miles from the center.



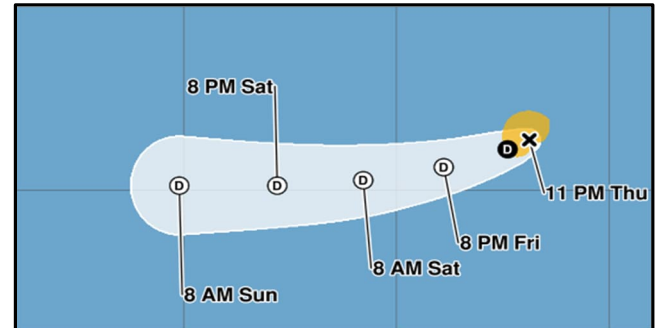
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Tropical Storm Hernan

- Located 1505 miles WSW of the southern tip of Baja California.
- Hernan is moving toward the south near 5 mph.
- A turn toward the south-southwest is expected on Friday, with a turn toward the west expected on Saturday.
- Maximum sustained winds are near 40 mph with higher gusts.
- Hernan is forecast to become a tropical depression on Friday and a post-tropical cyclone early Saturday.
- Tropical-storm-force winds extend outward up to 45 miles from the center.

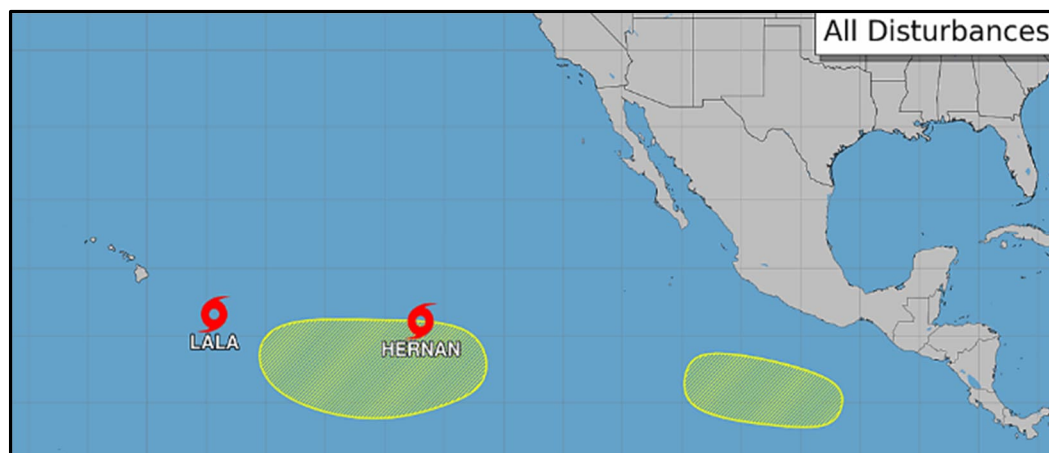


Disturbance 1

- An area of low pressure could form several hundred miles south of the coast of southern Mexico early next week.
- Some gradual development of this system is possible thereafter while the system moves westward or WNW well south of Mexico.
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (near 0%); 7-day: Low (20%)

Disturbance 2

- An area of low pressure could form well to the WSW of the southern tip of the Baja California Peninsula early next week.
- Gradual additional development of this system is possible thereafter while it moves generally westward.
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (near 0%); 7-day: Low (20%)



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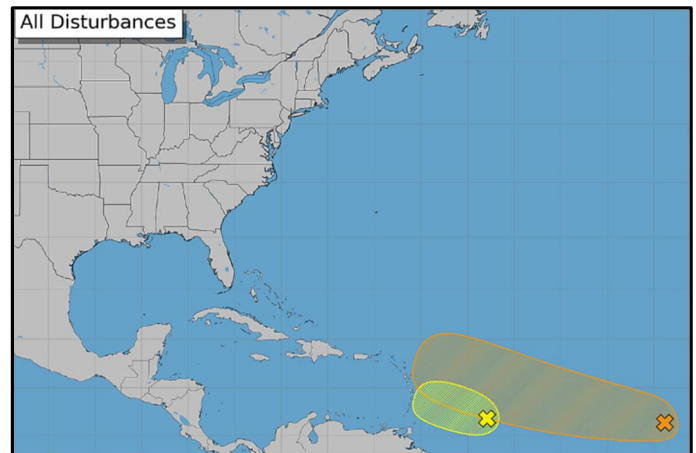
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Tropical Activity – Atlantic

Disturbance 1

- Located 400 miles east of the Windward Islands and is producing gusty winds and a large area of showers and thunderstorms.
- This system is moving into a region of increasing upper-level winds and dry air, and the potential of development continues to decrease.
- Even though development is unlikely, gusty winds and areas of heavy rain are possible across portions of the Lesser Antilles tonight and on Saturday.
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (20%); 7-day: Low (20%)



Disturbance 2

- Located more than 1000 miles west of the Cabo Verde Islands.
- Conditions are forecast to be generally conducive for gradual development, and a tropical depression could form this weekend or early next week.
- Moving westward or WNW across the central tropical Atlantic.
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (30%); 7-day: Med (50%)
