Wildfire Activity

Washington

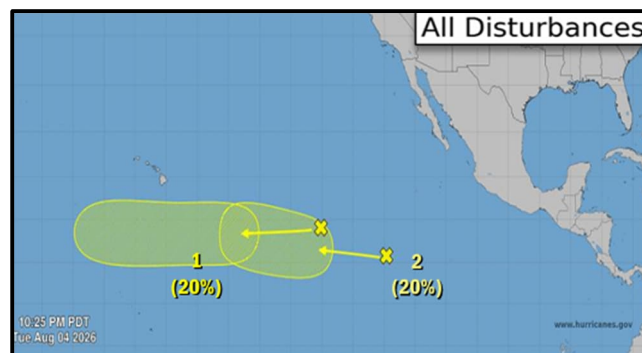
- Fast-moving wildfires near Spokane, Washington, forced about 65,000 people to evacuate and damaged or destroyed at least 700 homes, businesses and other structures over the weekend, authorities said.
- More than 10,000 acres have burned between the Old Trails, Autumn Lane and Fairview fires, with zero containment, as fire crews from across the country have rushed to assist.
- Smoke from the fires has become so dense that the City of Spokane is warning residents to avoid driving unless evacuating, saying visibility could rapidly deteriorate as winds shift.
- On Tuesday, President Donald Trump authorized an emergency declaration, providing FEMA support and federal resources to Washington and tribal nations.
- Temperatures are expected to climb into the mid-90s Wednesday and Thursday, with parts of Washington potentially topping 100 degrees. No rain is expected in the extended forecast over the next 10 days, limiting relief for crews battling the fires.
- By Friday, winds are expected to pick back up, with gusts of 20 to 30 mph possible around Spokane.



Tropical Activity – Eastern & Central Pacific

Disturbance 1

- Located in the western portion of the east Pacific, moving W at 10 to 15 mph.
- Environmental conditions appear marginally conducive for slow development over the next several days.
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (near 0%); 7-day: Low (20%)



Disturbance 2

- Located in the central portion of the east Pacific moving W at 10 to 15 mph.
- Environmental conditions are currently unfavorable but could become more conducive for slow development over the weekend into early next week.
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (near 0%); 7-day: Low (20%)
