July 1, 2026

Flash Flood Threat Florida

- While an area of low pressure off the Southeast coast has no chance of tropical development, it will still funnel deep tropical moisture into Florida.
- Rounds of heavy rain and the potential for localized flooding are expected on Wednesday.
- The weak, non-tropical system isn't expected to organize into a named storm, but its impacts will still be felt.
- As the disturbance interacts with a southward-moving cold front, showers and thunderstorms are expected to become more widespread, raising the risk of minor flooding across parts of Florida.
- Parts of Florida are under a Level 1 of 4 risk for flash flooding through Wednesday across Southeast Florida.
- Cities like Jacksonville and Tallahassee are seeing showers and thunderstorms.
- Storms may repeatedly move over the same areas increasing the risk of localized urban flash flooding, especially around Miami and the rest of Southeast Florida.



Wildfire Activity Colorado

- As of July 1, 2026, the Aspen Acres Fire is burning across Custer and Pueblo counties of Colorado.
- The fire is affecting areas near the communities of Beulah, Rye, San Isabel, and the Aspen Acres Campground.
- Approximately 28,314 acres burned. Fire officials said there was some unexpected growth on the northwest flank Tuesday due to changing weather.
- Containment: 0% contained as of the latest official update this morning. Crews are working toward establishing initial containment, but challenging weather continues.
- An estimated 155 structures (including homes, barns, and outbuildings) have been destroyed across Pueblo and Custer counties.
- Mandatory evacuations remain in effect for Rye, Beulah, San Isabel, and several surrounding areas. Shelters remain open in Pueblo.
- More than 650 personnel are expected to be assigned by Thursday, with additional crews arriving from across the country, including Alaska.
