

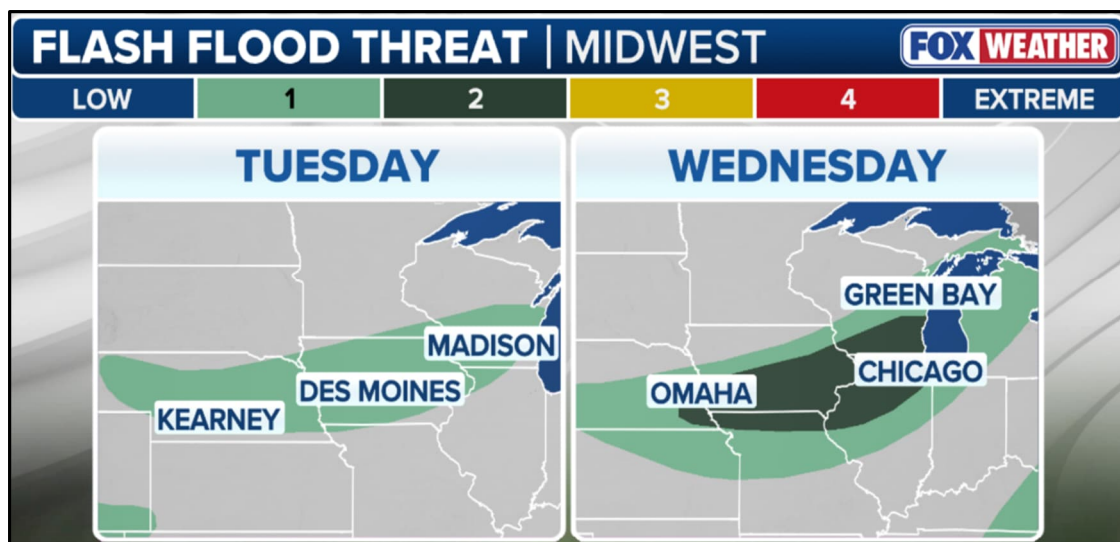

WSP USA FIELD SERVICES DISASTER AWARENESS REPORT

August 3, 2026

Flash Flood Threat Midwest U.S.

- Severe thunderstorms are set to return across portions of the Northern Plains and Upper Midwest, bringing large hail and damaging winds to the region.
- According to the FOX Forecast Center, the severe weather threat will impact the area Monday before shifting toward heavy rain and flash flooding across parts of the Midwest by the middle of the week.
- Starting Monday, the severe weather threat will focus on eastern North Dakota and northwestern Minnesota, where the Storm Prediction Center has issued a Level 2 out of 5 risk for severe storms.
- Storms are expected to develop this morning, but by the afternoon, the atmosphere is expected to recover as warm, humid air moves back into the region.
- New storms are then expected to form along an approaching cold front, with large hail and damaging wind gusts as the primary threats.
- Farther south across South Dakota and Nebraska, only isolated storms are expected. However, any storm that does develop could produce hail and strong wind gusts.
- By Tuesday and Wednesday, the cold front will slow down as it moves into the Midwest, allowing rounds of showers and thunderstorms to develop.
- Forecasters expect some areas could see rainfall rates between 1 and 2 inches per hour.
- The flooding threat is expected to increase Wednesday night into early Thursday, especially from southern Iowa and northern Missouri into northern Illinois, including the Chicago area, and southern Wisconsin.



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Wildfire Activity Washington

- More than 600 structures have been destroyed as rapidly spreading wildfires close in on Spokane, Washington, amid an ongoing wildfire emergency impacting the Pacific Northwest.
- Thousands of residents have been forced to evacuate as multiple wildfires race across the Spokane area, triggering expanding Level 3 "Go Now" orders.
- Winds have drastically backed down and will continue to ease as an area of high pressure moves in over the next couple of days.
- Multiple wind-driven wildfires are burning along Spokane's western and northwestern flank as extreme fire weather pushes flames toward neighborhoods on the edge of Washington's second-largest city.
- More than 7,000 acres have burned between the Old Trails, Autumn Lane and Fairview fires, with zero containment, as fire crews from across the country have rushed to assist.
- Gov. Bob Ferguson has declared a state of emergency and issued a burn ban through Sept. 30.
- Spokane County has also declared its own state of emergency to aid in timely response efforts.
- Multiple Level 3 evacuation orders have been issued for parts of north-west Spokane, Riverside State Park, the West Plains and surrounding communities.
- The other two wildfires burning in the Spokane area are the Fairview Fire and the Autumn Lane Fire. They've burned over 1,000 and 3,300 acres, respectively.
