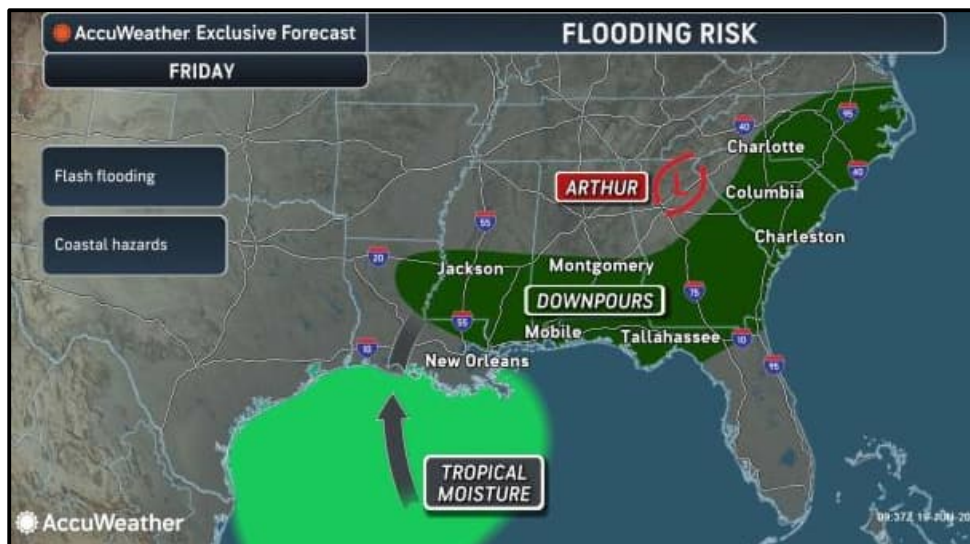

Tropical Activity – Atlantic

Remnants of Post-Tropical Storm Arthur

- Post-Tropical Storm Arthur's remnants are moving through the Southeast, causing flooding, damage and water rescues.
- The flash flood threat will remain across the South and into the Mid-Atlantic throughout Friday.
- "Heavy rainfall will be fueled by tropical moisture, delivering rainfall rates of 2-4 inches per hour across portions of the Gulf Coast," adds AccuWeather Meteorologist Alexander Duffus.
- This will particularly be the case from southern Mississippi and Alabama to the Florida Panhandle or western Georgia, where the greatest risk of flash flooding is expected.
- River flooding will also be a concern as numerous rivers are expected to reach moderate to major flood stages into next week.
- "Many of the rivers across Alabama, southwestern Georgia and western portions of the Florida Panhandle are in the flatlands and flow slowly, so the flood cycle takes much longer to complete," said Senior Meteorologist Alex Sosnowski. "Some rivers may not crest until next week."
- According to the FOX Forecast Center, conditions are marginally conducive for any new tropical or subtropical development, placing it at a 10% chance of development over the next two days.



Louisiana

- The National Weather Service said one tornado has been confirmed in Avoyelles Parish and three others near New Orleans.
- At least 200 homes in Avoyelles Parish, rural Louisiana, flooded after more than two feet of rain fell in 48 hours, most of it on Thursday.
- In Covington, the Tchefuncte River is at 25 feet and is expected to crest at moderate flood stage.
- The Tangipahoa River near Robert is at 18 feet and is cresting at moderate flood stage.
- Gov. Landry declared a state of emergency for Avoyelles, Lafourche, Pointe Coupee, St. Landry, St. Tammany, and Terrebonne parishes.

Mississippi

- Water rescues have taken place in Harrison County.
- Multiple roads remain closed in George, Hancock, Harrison, Pearl River, and Stone counties.
- In Pearl River County, at least 30 homes have been evacuated as the Anchor Lake Dam is at risk of flooding.
- The Pearl River is currently at flood stage at 16.6 ft and is expected to reach moderate flood stage at 17.50 ft Monday afternoon.
- Unconfirmed tornadoes also were reported in Hancock and northwest Harrison counties. The NWS will be on the ground in South Mississippi on Friday to survey the damage.

Tropical Activity – Western Pacific

Tropical Depression 07W

- Located 240 miles W of Guam, moving WNW at 15 mph.
- Maximum sustained winds at 35 mph.
- Forecast to strengthen as it tracks WNW to the S of Guam.
